



Susan B. Anthony (1820-1906) recalls her life as an earnest, and for a time, a frivolous, young woman and the events that brought her in 1851 to meet Elizabeth Cady Stanton. Shortly thereafter, Anthony became a full-time worker for woman's rights,—her right to the control of her own person, her right to ownership of her wages, her right to the guardianship of her children—and finally, her right to woman's suffrage.
